In the San Mateo County Community College District race, incumbent Richard Holober raised \$2,450 in the reporting period from Sept. 22 to Oct. 19. He has raised \$8,553.11 total and spent \$5,950.55 total. Contributions include \$2,000 from the California Nurses Association Political Action Committee and \$100 from the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees.

In the Hillsborough City Elementary School District race, incumbent Lynne Esselstein raised \$1,275 during this period. She has raised \$2,445 total and spent \$2,086.12 total. She gave herself a \$1,000 loan during this period. Expenses include postage, postage printing, printing and assembling fliers and campaign literature and mailings.

Candidate Don Geddis raised \$1,375 during this period. He has raised \$12,955 total and spent \$4,515 total. Expenses included campaign literature and mailings and campaign paraphernalia.

Candidate Kaarin Hardy raised \$774 during this period. She has raised \$2,252 total and spent \$1,216 total.

Candidate Pearl Wu had yet to submit her form Monday afternoon.

In the San Carlos Elementary School District race, candidate Nicole Bergeron raised \$50. She raised \$550 total and hasn't spent any money. She received a \$50 from Jim Granucci, retired San Carlos police chief.

Appointed incumbents Carol Elliott and Kathleen Farley, along with candidate Sarah Stiefel, had yet to submit their forms Monday afternoon.

Friends of the Belmont-Redwood Shores Schools 2013 Yes on R campaign raised \$19,203.50 during this time period. Overall, it has raised \$63,560.21 and spent \$53,293.24. Ralston Middle School PTA gave \$1,499; Cipriani PTA gave \$500; Central School PTA gave \$999; Fox School PTA gave \$999; and Redwood Shores Elementary School PTA gave \$999. Expenses include bank fees, reimbursements for volunteers, photography, campaign literature and mailings, yard signs, shipping and printing.

In the Sequoia Union High School District race, candidate Georgia Jack raised \$4,391 during this period. She has raised \$30,005 total and spent \$23,089 total. The sheet metal workers union gave \$400; Trustee Carrie Du Bois gave \$645.96 for campaign literature and postage. Expenses included print ads and campaign literature and mailings.

Incumbent Alan Sarver raised \$6,761 during this time period. He has raised \$11,553 total and spent \$6,159 total. He received a \$1,000 and \$2,000 loan from himself and Emily Sarver during this period. Expenses include campaign literature and mailings and postage costs.

Incumbent Chris Thomsen raised \$8,425 during this period. He has raised \$17,500 total and spent \$13,956.83 total.

In the Belmont-Redwood Shores Elementary School District race, candidate Amy Koo raised \$2,089 during this period. She has raised \$2,089 total and spent \$233 total. She gave herself a \$370 loan. Expenses included an ad in the Pilot newsletter and the American Dream Fund gave \$2,089 for her website, signs and mailers.

Candidates Suvarna Bhopale, Herbert Neuman, Naomi Nishimoto, Rakesh Hegde and Charles Velschow had yet to submit their forms Monday afternoon.
